Our fabulous annual Book Fair, a shop in our school, a chance for students to practice real world use of money, is coming in May – Family Reading Month. The commission we receive and take in books adds substantially to our library. Since 2006, Book Fair has put over \$32,000 worth of books on the shelves, resources the school would not otherwise have had. Every dollar equals resources for our school. Please come and support it. Book Fair commences on National Simultaneous Storytime day. 2024's nominated book, *Bowerbird Blues* is on the shelf.

Reading is food for the soul and like riding a bike, the more we do the easier it grows! It begins with parents, board books and babies, snuggles at

bedtime and precious time with mum and dad. It requires imagination and comprehension, develops brains, enriches vocabulary and increases understanding. A longitudinal study on 4000 Australian children from age 4/5 in 2004 to the age of 10/11 in 2010 found the single most important determiner of success in reading, assessments like NAPLAN and schooling was whether or not children were read to from a young age. Many other studies concur. It isn't wealth, cultural background, parental income or education that determines how well a child will do academically. It's whether or not they have books at home and people to share them with.
