'Quirky and laid back, Tjupurru quickly has an audience greeting him and responding to his questions in the language of his ancestors the Djabera Djabera people from the Kimberly region of WA. With numerous opportunities for both individual on stage and whole audience participation, Didjeribone is a uniquely Australian music experience accompanied by personal and ancestral stories. Using the Didjeribone, face bass and cutting-edge music production equipment, music is played, recorded, then instantly played back on a loop to form a backing track. The process is repeated with loop track after loop track being added, creating a rich, deep, multilayered soundscape. It's then that the true magic happens as from the Didjeribone the haunting wind, howling dingoes and humorous kookaburras populate this genuinely Australian piece of music.'


The student council will be collecting the donated gold coins before school. Thanks for supporting this great initiative, supporting our school and our environment.

The importance of a literacy rich environment at home

Reading comprehension involves two primary processes. Reading printed text and understanding the language of the text. Becoming a reader is not effortless.

A great deal of research has demonstrated strong links between early spoken language skills and learning to read. Supporting children spoken language development provides a natural bridge, if you like, for the development of literacy

These keys skills are phonological awareness. This refers to a child's awareness of different sounds in their language and includes an awareness of rhyme and how sounds link together to make words.

Other important skills include understanding that print carries meaning, how to hold a book, turn pages in a book and read from left to right.



Also, understanding and using words of different types such as naming words, action words and describing words, and having a wide range of words to express their thoughts, feelings and ideas.

Finally, a child's ability to tell a story and describe real or fictional events from the past, the present or the future is a valuable skill.

Parents and carers can support the reading development of children by creating language and literacy rich environments, engaging their child in conversation, and through shared story book reading.

If you have concerns about your child's speech or language development or their progress in reading, discuss this with their classroom teacher.


